1.9 “**Consortium or joint venture**” means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skills and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract.

1.10 “**Contract**” means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state.

1.11 “**Specific contract participation goals**” means the goals as stipulated in the Preferential Procurement Regulation 2017. In addition to above-mentioned goals, the Regulations [12. 4. **Best Approach/Merit:** Involves the municipality choosing the most suitable provider according to particular project requirements and the provider's specialised expertise. Additionally, selection may be based on the highest scores achieved during the initial panel tender process.

Expenditure - Allocation will be managed to ensure that the total value of work is distributed as evenly as possible across the panel over the contract term

Operational Rules

1. **No Guarantee of Work:** Being appointed to a panel does not guarantee a minimum amount of work or a contract for any specific assignment
2. **Performance Management:** Continued inclusion on the panel often depends on performance. Poor performance on one task can lead to being bypassed for future rotations or removed from the panel entirely.
