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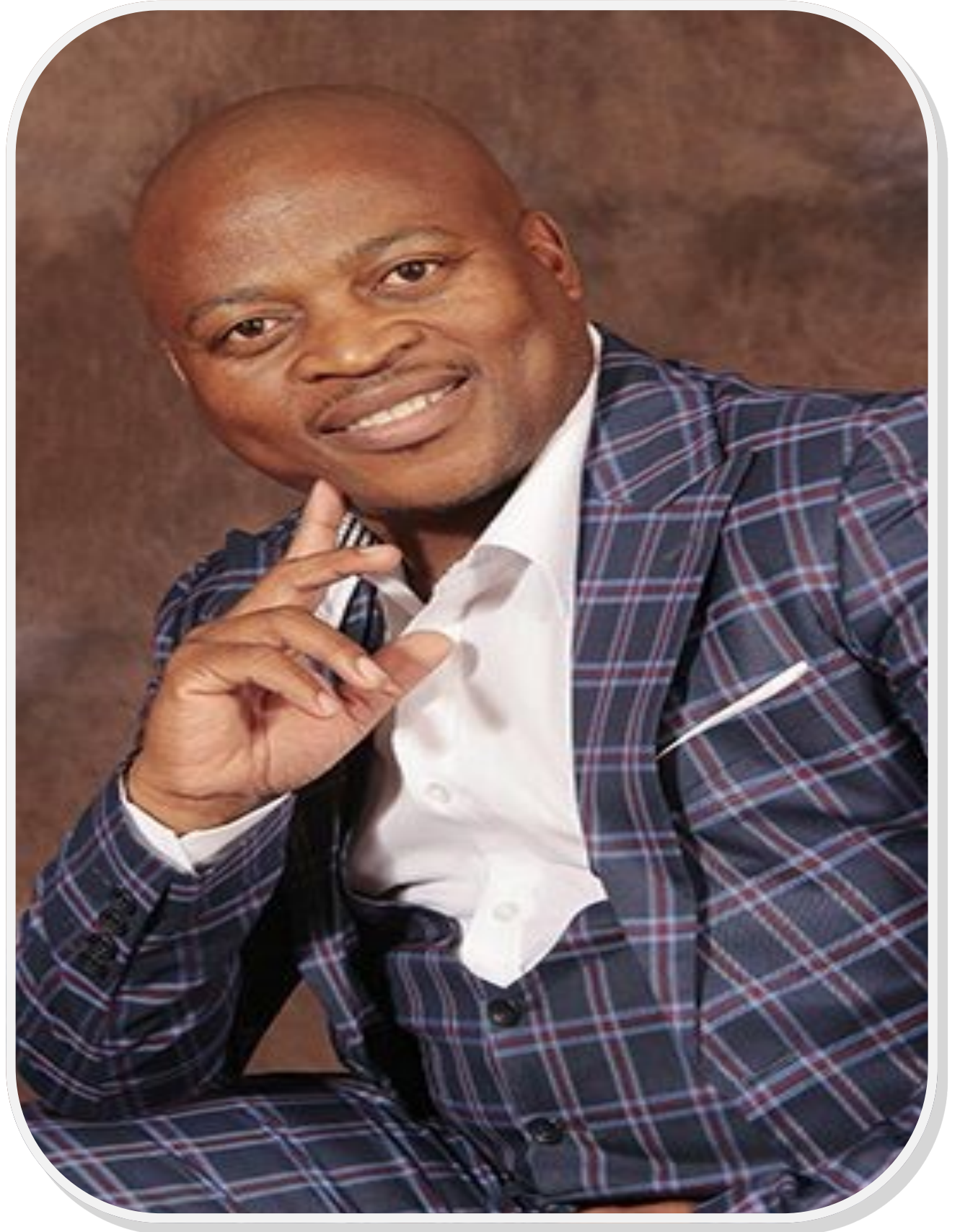
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## WORD FROM MUNICIPAL MANAGER

Firstly I would like to congratulate the incoming council that will be leading Mohokare Local Municipality for the term of 5 years commencing on the year 2016 – 2021. It is with my utmost pleasure that I would like to also bid farewell to the outgoing council of the Mohokare Local Municipality, commending them on the good work done during their term as a council with the pivotal role they played by managing to take the municipality from the status it was in prior to 2011.

The municipality was faced with the challenge of instability in terms of facing a continuous Disclaimer Audit Opinion due to insufficient financial administration in place. The Municipality was faced with the challenge of a prolonged availability of unfilled posts due to the financial constraints it was under. However in light of the few mentioned challenges amongst many others, the outgoing council managed to re-structure the organization by ensuring the occupation and filling of the necessary posts within the institution. And this was achieved through the assistance that was availed for three years from COGTA and the Free State Provincial Government which assisted with addressing a number of challenges the Municipality had been faced with.

It is equally important to note with recognition the achievements that were obtained under the leadership and management of the Mohokare Local Municipalities former council.



The success was achieved in terms of retaining stability by implementing the necessary service delivery and control measures within the organization, upon the restructuring the organizations administration operations improved tremendously.

The Municipality managed to achieve a positive audit opinion moving from disclaimer audit opinion to a qualified audit opinion then further progressed to an unqualified audit opinion for two consecutive years. Some of the other few achievements that were obtained are the:

- ⇒ Zastron/Matlakeng construction of 2,9 km pavement access collector internal streets and related.
- ⇒ Zastron/Matlakeng installation of 16 high mast lights in Refeng Khotso.
- ⇒ Smithfield/Mofulatshepe installation of 14 high mast lights.
- ⇒ Matlakeng upgrading of sports grounds.

Despite the mentioned achievements there are still a number of challenges that the Municipality is still faced with such as working towards obtaining a Clean Audit Opinion, working towards gaining Financial Viability and improving the Economic Development and Stability of the Municipality as well as ensuring the quality of service delivery.

The new council together with management and the Municipality personnel need to work tirelessly in trying to achieve the goals we have set for ourselves as an institution. Although the Municipality is solely dependent on Government grants for sustainable funding given the slight revenue base of the Municipality the municipality has worked tirelessly in utilizing sufficiently the grants to maximize service delivery for the benefit of the community at large even though efforts to collect revenue have not been left behind.

As previously mentioned the municipality is solely dependent on grants which are provided and availed specifically to attend to certain issues, leaving little room for the rendering of services using these grants. The Municipality ensures to work harder in order to render quality service delivery.

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## **KNOW YOUR COUNCILLORS**

It is of utmost importance that as south Africans we should know our councillors as they are the link between the municipality and the community they serve. People can also take their problems to the ward councillor and he/she is responsible of to deal with these in an appropriate way.

### **WHAT IS A COUNCILLOR?**

- A councillor is a person who provides political leadership in a ward of a Municipality. It can be a Metropolitan Municipality, District municipality or Local municipality.
- A local councillor can be elected as an independent candidate or represent a political party. They occupy an office for a period of five years in line with the local government elections. The ward councillor is elected by citizens living in the ward where he/she is standing for elections.

### **WHAT IS THE ROLE OF A COUNCILLOR?**

- A ward councillor is expected to make sure that the concerns raised by people in his/her ward are represented in council. He/she must also ensure that the ward committee exists and that people in the ward participate in local government. The councillor must report back regularly through ward meetings and help the community in identifying needs and priority areas of development , which will help the municipality's planning processes.

### **TYPES OF COUNCILLORS:**

- A ward councillor ensures that the interests of the people in a specific ward are represented in council. He/she reports on council activities on a regular basis to strengthen the relationship with the community.
- A proportional representative councillor is a member of a political party and is elected through the party lists. He/ she accounts to the party.
- An independent councillor does not belong to a political party and is accountable to the people who elected him/her.

# 8 104 MAYORAL PROGRAMME

**O**n the 28th of October the honourable Mayor of Mothokare launched her 104 mayoral programme. The 104 Mayoral programme is a programme from the office of the Premier intended to address the problems that were raised by the community during the door-to-door's. This initiative is aimed at addressing service delivery issues and is also a way to instil the culture of keeping our communities clean. Starting with the cleaning campaign which focused on addressing cleanliness and illegal dumping site challenges in the three towns. The cleaning campaign which commenced in Zastron was driven through mass participation by municipal employees alongside Epwp and CPW this same initiative was taken to Rouxville and Smithfield. This will be an on-going programme that aims to ensure that the community understands the dangers of living in an unhealthy environment as well as the importance of establishing participation between the Municipality and the community in order for there to be common ground. The programme will include the maintenance and cleaning of sports grounds, the fixing of roads to informal settlements as ambulances are faced with problems of accessing roads in order to fetch patients. This programme includes road shows that will encourage eligible community members to come and register their names on the indigent register, **continued on pg10**

As shown on the pictures below municipal workers went out in numbers to clean the streets of Zastron, Smithfield and Rouxville. With the current national drought problem the resuscitation of boreholes is also prioritised this will bring relief to the current shortage of water the Municipality is putting their best foot forward in their quest to mitigate the drought and it must not be lost to people especially those that are to benefit from the drought interventions that the responsibility to save water is still there. The 104 Mayoral programme will pave the way for service delivery to have a more significant impact and can reach all community members.





# 10 **MATRICULANTS PRAYER SESSION**

The Mayor alongside Councillors and Municipal officials as part of the 104 mayoral programme visited schools to conduct prayer sessions for grade 12 pupils who were about to commence with their final exams. The Mayor being a proud product of Mohokare felt it was important to encourage these learners about the opportunities at their disposal, she went on to explain about bursary opportunities and that learners should never allow their background to hold them back. The learners then took a pledge to conduct the exams in a dignified manner. After the anticipation of the final Matric results it is indeed a proud moment as Free State province produced the highest number of pupils who passed their 2016 Grade 12 examinations. The Free state being number one nationally, Xhariep District as number one in all districts with a 93% pass rate. Mohokare is the number one circuit in the district with Lere-la-Thuto having obtained 96% pass rate with 41 that qualified for a Bachelors degree, 30 Diplomas and 2 Certificates.

These learners proved that they may be from a small town but their minds, strengths and futures are definitely not small. Mohokare is extremely proud of these exemplary learners who have produced extraordinary results

The MEC encouraged the family members who had lost their loved ones that they were in our prayers and thoughts, furthermore he emphasized the fact that people need to always be careful on the road to avoid further incidences from occurring.

On the 30th of December funerals of the victims were conducted in a dignified manner. The Mayor of Mohokare and Executive Mayor of Xhariep district attended the funeral to offer their most sincere condolences may the families find peace and their loved one's rest in peace.
